The Preamble of the Indian Constitution

WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens:

JUSTICE, social, economic and political;

LIBERTY of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship;

EQUALITY of status and of opportunity;

and to promote among them all

FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation

In Our Constituent Assembly this twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, do Hereby Adopt, Enact and Give to Ourselves This Constitution.

- To abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem;
- To cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom;
- To uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India;

SACRED HEART COLLEGE AUTONOMOUS

Sacred Heart College (Autonomous), Thevara, Kochi is a grant-in-aid Autonomous college affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam, Kerala. The College is managed by the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI), a Christian religious congregation founded by St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara, the first Christian saint of Kerala. The CMI Congregation manages a network of over 500 institutions in India and abroad, including more than 250 schools, about 50 Arts and Science Colleges, 1 University, 1 Medical college, 5 Engineering Colleges, 12 Technical colleges, 18 non-formal educational institutions, 17 cultural centres etc. The College was established in 1944 as a higher educational institute for men on the basis of minority rights. It started admitting girls in 1975 and serves all sections of the society without any discrimination of caste or creed. The college offers 25 UG, 21 PG, 1 PG

Integrated programme and 7 Doctoral programmes. The current student strength of the College is 3543, with 64% constituted by girls. There are 200+ faculty members and 72+ administrative staff besides, 28 adjunct/part-time teachers, in the institution. Currently, the college comprises three campuses: the Central Campus, East Campus, and Media Campus.

Sacred Heart College was one among the pioneers to seek assessment and accreditation by NAAC and was accredited with Five-Star status in 2000. In the subsequent accreditations the College was accorded A+, A, A+ Grade in 2007, 2013 and 2022 respectively. The college was granted Autonomous status by UGC in 2014; partner institute status by EDCIL of MHRD in 2017 and selected for RUSA in 2018. The college was declared a 'College with Potential for Excellence' (CPE) by UGC in 2004 and the status was

extended in 2009 and 2014 respectively. It was elevated as a Mentor College under Paramarsh Scheme in 2018; granted DST-FIST fund in 2009 and 2018 and granted Unnat Bharat Abhiyan scheme in 2018. The College has been rated the Best College in the State and one among the top 30 colleges in India in Arts, Science and Commerce in the surveys conducted by India Today and The Week magazines since 2014. The college secured the 48th position nationally in the NIRF rankings 2024.

Responding to the needs of the turbulent 1940s, the college was envisioned as a humble abode of learning and a corner stone for nation-building by its zealous founding fathers. Today, Sacred Heart College, the pioneering educational initiative of the CMI in Kerala, stands tall in academic excellence and public esteem. Fondly nurtured and ably steered by visionary fathers of the CMI, the college has evolved into a premier centre of higher education through its eight decades of fruitful academic journey. The college is now poised at a momentous threshold of growth, happily blending its rich past, rewarding present and the optimistic future.

Highlighting the importance of autonomous colleges, the UGC document on the XI Plan states: "The only safe and better way to improve the quality of undergraduate education is to de-link most of the colleges from the affiliating structure. Colleges with academic and operative freedom are doing better and have more credibility. The financial support to such colleges boosts the concept of autonomy." It was proposed to increase the number of autonomous colleges to spread the culture of autonomy and the target was to make 10 per cent of eligible colleges autonomous by the end of the XI Plan period.

Need for Autonomy:

The affiliating system of colleges was originally designed when their number in a university was small. The university could then effectively oversee the working of the colleges, act as an examining body, and award degrees on their behalf. Under this system the colleges do not have the freedom to modernize their curricula or make them locally relevant. The regulations of the

university and its common system, governing all colleges alike, irrespective of their characteristic strengths, weaknesses and locations, have affected the academic development of individual colleges. Colleges that have the potential for offering programmes of a higher standard do not have the freedom to offer them. The 1964-66 Education Commission pointed out that the exercise of academic freedom by teachers is a crucial requirement for development of the intellectual climate of our country. Unless such a climate prevails, it is difficult to achieve excellence in our higher education system. With students, teachers and management being co-partners in raising the quality of higher education, it is imperative that they share a major responsibility. Hence the Education Commission (1964-66) recommended college autonomy, which, in essence, is the instrument for promoting academic excellence.

The heartian academic community, especially, the faculty and the administrative staff, has very cautiously, but

determinedly, embraced this opportunity, and with utmost dedication, has dispensed its responsibilities in this regard. We aspire to attain that privileged state when the design and delivery of our curricula will be a creative response to the needs and aspirations of the milieu. Steps have already been initiated in this direction at the undergraduate and post-graduate levels. To ensure this, the principal bodies involved in the governance of autonomous colleges, viz., Governing Body, Academic Council, Boards of Studies and Finance Committee - are constituted with adequate representation of experts from all walks of life.

Multi-Disciplinary Courses (MDC) are designed to enable the students to broaden their intellectual experience by understanding the conceptual foundations of Science, Social Sciences, Humanities, and Liberal Arts. Students are not be eligible to take the MDC in the same discipline that they have studied during their +2 or the major they pursue for their UG Programme. The batch strength and availability of multidisciplinary courses offered each year depend on the MG University regulations and the college's policy. Sacred Heart College offers multi-disciplinary courses in 14 aided disciplines and 17 self-financing disciplines.

CAMPUS RULES

The college functions as a community and it is expected of each member of the community that they respect the rights of the others as individuals and should provide space for them to grow in knowledge and attain personal development and fulfilment. Rights entail responsibilities. The following set of rules is based on the fundamental tenet that each individual has a responsibility to respect the rights of the other and is expected to conduct themselves with self-discipline and dignity.

Information and notification

All notifications regarding admissions, interviews, working days, exam/re-exam schedule, placements, fee payment, holidays, competitions and all other matters related to the academic life of the students shall be notified primarily through the college website. The notice boards also may be utilized for notifications. Therefore, the students shall have to frequently check the college website in addition to the notice boards for such notifications.

Campus Timing:

The classes will commence at 8.00 am/ 9.30 am and will be over by 1.30 pm/ 3.30 pm. Thereafter, the students can stay on the campus for academic or co-curricular work with the permission of the head of the institution. Students are expected to adhere to the college timing, hence latecomers will not be admitted to the class. No student will be allowed to leave the campus before the class hours are over.

No student will be allowed to leave the campus during the college hours except with the special permission of the head of the institution.

Attestation by Principal's office: All applications for attestation by the principal should be submitted before 1.30 pm. (Each of the documents to be attested has to be brought ready after verification by

respective class teacher or HoD after matching with the originals). The attested documents can be collected from the office at 2.30 pm. Meeting the Principal (for students): Monday to Friday – 1.30 pm to 2.30 pm. All matters related to academics and discipline on the campus will be under the supervision of the Principal/Academic Head of the campus. Parents can meet the Principal/Academic Head during the recess and after the class hours (Monday to Friday). Should they wish to meet him at other times they should take prior appointments.

Political Activities:

All students of this campus should understand that all sorts of political activities, or activities of students' organizations supported by political parties are banned on this campus. Students shall not participate or take part in any such activities. Meetings or demonstrations within the campus, organized or supported by any organization or political parties, disrupting the classes, or interfering with the peaceful functioning of the college will be treated as serious breach of the college discipline.

Ragging:

According to the Prohibition of Ragging Act, Kerala, 1998, Section 3, the Principal is bound, whenever any student or a teacher of an educational Institution/Hostel or the parent or guardian of the students, as the case may be, complains in writing about ragging either inside or outside their institution, to take prompt action (by reporting to the police) in accordance with the said Act, in order to nip in the bud the deleterious consequences of ragging, both physical and mental, on the victims.

Use of Private Vehicle:

The College does not encourage students bringing their private vehicles to the campus and there shall not be any parking facility for 4-wheelers. Students who use two-wheelers are expected to park their vehicles only in the space provided for the purpose. If the allotted space is full, the students will have to find their own parking space outside the campus. A special permission in the prescribed form has to be obtained for bringing one's vehicle to the campus.

Parking will be at the owner's risk. No vehicle is allowed to ply through the East campus between 8.00 am and 2.30 pm and in the central campus between at 9.30 am to 3.30 pm.

Use of Mobile Phone:

Use of mobile phone and camera is not allowed on the campus during working hours. All emergency calls received by the information desk will be connected to the students. In case a faculty member requires his/her students to use mobile phones for an academic activity, he/she should obtain prior permission from the Principal to use the device.

Dress Code:

All students on the campus are bound to follow the dress code/uniform prescribed by the college. The college dress code insists to reveal face fully, covers the body in such a way that it does not show forth bare arms, and shoulders above elbow and shall reach below knees.

ID Cards:

Students have to wear the college ID cards at all times on the campus. If a student leaves the campus during class hours, he/she should register their passage using the same at the security post.

Extra-curricular activities:

The campus is committed to enriching student life through extracurricular activities. Hence all such activities shall be under the guidance of faculty members. No extra-curricular activities shall be permitted during the class hours. Students are encouraged to stay on campus and utilize the time for additional courses, library work, extracurricular activities etc.

General Discipline

In accordance with the local culture and tradition and the policy of the management the following guidelines are given to the students regarding how they should conduct themselves in the college

campus. Students of the college shall cooperate with the college authorities and staff to ensure an atmosphere conducive to the academic activities and the overall development of the community and for the maintenance of discipline on the campus.

1. Students are expected to conduct themselves in a dignified manner at all times. Each student has a responsibility to contribute to the academic atmosphere of the college.
2. Respectful behaviour towards the staff at all times is expected of every student of the college.
3. Classes will be conducted from 8.00 am to 1.30 pm in the East campus and 9.30 am to 3.30 pm in the central and media campus. Students should, on no account, arrive late for the class. At the stroke of the third bell, students should stand up for the morning Prayer marking the beginning of the academic activities on the campus.
4. No student shall enter a classroom other than their own, without the permission from the members of the staff, whether it is before, during or after the working hours.
5. Students shall use the college property with care and keep the building and furniture clean.
6. No student is allowed to collect money from their colleagues either by request or by coercion or buy and sell any article on the college campus except with the specific permission of the Head of the campus.
7. The loss or damage caused to the college articles will have to be made good by the student concerned by paying double the value of damaged/lost item.
8. Students should obtain permission from the college authorities to stay back after 5.30 p.m.
9. Students need to obtain explicit permission from the head of the campus to take part in any programme outside the campus during the working hours or to represent the college in such events.
